

Local Organization To Give Away 300 Seedlings

NOBLESVILLE, INDIANA – Beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, April 30, three hundred shagbark hickory seedlings will be given away on the lawn of the historic Noblesville Courthouse Square, an Arbor Day celebration by the civic group Keep Noblesville Beautiful.

“They’re free, they’re beautiful trees that adapt well to many sites, and they’re here until we run out,” said event organizer Brenda White. “It’s a wonderful way to mark Arbor Day.”

Hamilton County Master Gardeners will be there, too, promoting their upcoming plant sale, handing out free hostas, and demonstrating how to divide perennials.

The following day, May 1st, the Noblesville Tree Board will be giving away 280 black gum and overcup oak saplings from 9:00 a.m. till noon, at Dr. James A. Dillon Park, as part of the city’s Arbor Day Celebration.

This marks the fourth year Keep Noblesville Beautiful has celebrated Arbor Day by giving out free seedlings.
