Keep Noblesville Beautiful will host its 10th Neighborhood Clean-up Blitz on June 14. And it needs volunteers.

This year's neighborhood is bordered by Fifth and Eighth streets and Cherry and Hannibal streets, and will take place from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Keep Noblesville Beautiful is a non-profit organization that engages citizens in beautifying the city, improving the quality of the environment and fostering pride in the community.

Volunteer tasks include mulching, pruning, weeding and sprucing up landscaped areas with the help of Hamilton County Master Gardeners and Indiana Department of Natural Resources Certified Free Stewards. City of Noblesville Street Department, Clean Storm Water Program and Noblesville Fire Department are assisting.

Sign-in will take place in the County Employee Parking Lot at Sixth and Cherry streets. Volunteers will receive snacks and lunch. Those under age 18 require a parent or guardian to sign a waiver.

Participating volunteer groups include North Side Crime Watch, National Honor Societies of Noblesville High School and Noblesville West Middle School, Manuka Girl Scout Troop 1637 and Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.
