

SERVE Noblesville June 24-27 . . .

Firestone area is major target

A huge "SERVE Noblesville" week will be held June 24-27.

"This will be a wonderful collaboration of churches, nonprofit and businesses doing a huge variety of service projects throughout the week in Noblesville," said Cindi Benedict, Community Engagement Manager, when making the announcement.

The project will have an extra push in the Firestone neighborhood.

Benedict said the work isn't limited to the Firestone area.

Patrick Propst, pastor of Faith Community Church, is the team leader. Fred Knoll is a major team member coordinating a number of projects.

SERVE Noblesville this year is partnering with Keep Noblesville Beautiful and their annual blitz and also partnering with Habitat for Humanity, which is doing two Apostle Builds during the week.

"There is so much going on, it is hard to distill it down," Benedict said.

Currently, 31 projects will be completed in four days which will beautify the Firestone neighborhood and the Noblesville Post Office; provide shelter for two families; repair homes for at least 10 families in need; provide day camp scholarships to 50 children; assist a school and nursing home; create hand-crafted items for local and international programs, and provide a community garage sale/health information fair to low-income families.

The group will begin each day at 8 a.m. at the Hamilton County Fairgrounds and then fan out across the city.
